

NJ Youth/Kids Camp COVID-19 Policies and Procedures

Pre-Camp

- Before leaving for camp, all leaders and parents/guardians of students attending must complete the following questionnaire brought with them on the day of camp.
 - In the last 14 days, has the participant attending camp or any member in your immediate household traveled: on a cruise ship; internationally anywhere outside the US?
 - In the last 14 days, has the participant attending camp been in close contact with any person diagnosed with COVID-19?
 - In the last 14 days has the participant attending camp been diagnosed with COVID-19?
 - Has the participant attending camp had any of these symptoms in the past 14 days? Fever, cough, and shortness of breath that is not explained by other health conditions?
 - Temperature taken and recorded no more than 24 hours before departure for camp.

** if the answer to any of these is yes or temperature greater than 100, the participant will not be allowed to attend camp.

Arrival

- Temperature will be taken upon arrival by camp by camp staff/nurse. Student(s) with temperatures over 100F will not be permitted to stay at camp.
- Check-in procedures will be modified to keep within suggested guidelines.
- Staggered arrival times will be suggested for larger groups in attendance.

Plans and Procedures

- Due to the nature of camp, social distancing may not be completely achieved, the following measures will be implemented for student health and safety:
 - Students will be assigned into groups and stay with those groups throughout much of the day
 - Meal times will be staggered
 - Hand sanitizer, soap, paper towels with a spray bottle or Clorox wipes will be provided to each counselor/room
 - Camp will be closed to outside visitors
- A nurse will be on staff during the week of Youth Camp
- If a person exhibits COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, difficulty breathing), the following protocols will be in place:
 - Person will be isolated and will be sent home.
 - Parents will responsible for picking up their child.
- High touch areas will be sanitized on a regular basis.

Facilities

- High traffic areas frequently sanitized.
- Spruce Lake will be providing sanitizer stations for all common entry areas and are adding signage to encourage hand washing, covering your cough, and monitoring your health.

Dorms

- Each bed is reserved for one person.
- Personal items should be stored and not strewn across rooms
- To provide safe distancing bunks will be configured for head to toe sleeping arrangements
- No sharing of supplies or personal items
- Daily showers are mandatory
- Avoid leaving personal items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc. on frequently touched surfaces

Activities/Worship/Food

- Activities and programs are being adjusted to keep them in compliance with our policies and protocols
- Spruce Lake will be providing a meeting room to accommodate our group not exceeding 75% of the room's capacity.
- Spruce Lake will be providing a two-entrée menu that will be plated by staff (cafeteria style)
- Staggered meal times will be in place to meet Health Department guidelines.
- Snack Shop: walk through ordering during scheduled hours – no indoor seating will be available

Disclaimer

An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. I understand that if my student develops symptoms of COVID-19 while at Camp, they will be isolated and asked to leave Camp at the discretion of the Camp nurse. I understand it is my responsibility to provide transportation home.

I understand that if my student answers yes to any of the below questions, I will not send them to Camp.

- 1. In the last 14 days, has the participant attending camp or any member in your immediate household traveled: on a cruise ship; internationally anywhere outside the US?**
- 2. In the last 14 days, has the participant attending camp been in close contact with any person diagnosed with COVID-19?**
- 3. In the last 14 days has the participant attending camp been diagnosed with COVID-19?**
- 4. Has the participant attending camp had any of these symptoms in the past 14 days? Fever, cough, and shortness of breath that is not explained by other health conditions?**
- 5. Temperature taken and recorded no more than 24 hours before departure for camp is 100F or above.**
